A list of fabrics and haberdashery required will be sent to participants nearer the time.



### **LINUS QUILTS and BLANKETS**



### Heather's Challenge to all WI members - Make a charity Linus Quilt, Knitted or Crocheted Blanket

These will be exhibited at the Arts and Crafts Showcase at Chorley Town Hall on Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> September 2024. They will need to be collected at your WI meeting and delivered to LFWI Offices in Leyland on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> September along with any entries for the Showcase. These will be distributed through the Lancashire Branch of PROJECT LINUS UK after the Showcase.

#### Specifications for quilts and blankets

Quilts need to be new, homemade, washable, and tumble dryable. They can be any of the following sizes:

Baby quilts approx. 24"-30" square or 24"x30"

Children's quilts: approx. 36"-42" square or 36"x42"

Teenager's quilts: approx. 42" square or 42"x48"

Knitted or crocheted blankets with no holes that fingers or equipment can get caught in - sizes as for quilts.

The quilts and blankets should not have any embellishments such as ribbons, buttons or beads because of possible choking and little fingers being damaged.
